



Barkly Regional Arts is....

Barkly Regional Arts (BRA) is a not-for-profit multi-arts organisation operating in the Barkly region of the Northern Territory.

BRA's home base is in Tennant Creek, working across a vast arid landscape of 310,000 sq km with predominately 6 very remote communities. The Barkly is inhabited by peoples whose song lines, story lines, art and living culture span thousands of years.

The operations and artistic delivery of Barkly Regional Arts is through 5 major programs :

- Winanjjikari Music Cente
- Media Mob
- Festivals and Events (Including the Desert Harmony Festival)
- Artists of the Barkly
- 8CCC Radio

Each of these programs employs full time staff with a focus on developing local capacity, projects for community development and engagement, training and professional development (locally and nationally), touring and presenting and fee for service work. Barkly Regional Arts provides an arts career and ensures there is a strong arts sector in the region for the community to access.

The Barkly region provides the setting for great artistic vibrancy. BRA continuously seeks ways to harness our place, such as celebrating the rich diversity of culture and language that we have the privilege to engage with.

In 2019, BRA continues to provide the diverse art platform that we are known for nationally. This artistic platform enables an ever-increasing artistic merit to be produced and shared locally, nationally and internationally.

MISSION

'The enduring purpose of BRA is to add living culture to the artistic merit of Australia whilst contributing creative industry opportunities in very remote communities'.

BRA PROGRAMS

WINANJJIKARI MUSIC MEDIA CENTRE

The Winanjjikari Music Media Centre develops local music and media resources, programs, personnel and production. The centre umbrellas two of BRA's departments: Winanjjikari Music and Media Mob. This creates a holistic delivery outcome with employees working across both mediums for increased skill development. WMMC promotes and supports emerging and established local artists and provides pathways to the arts for the general community. WMMC also supports major events, community events and projects across the region.

ARTISTS OF THE BARKLY

The program supports the creative practise & emergence of the Barkly Indigenous visual artists. The region is known for its vibrant & direct style of storytelling paintings, fibre art, cultural knowledge paintings, fabric printing traditional artefacts & printmaking. The priority communities include Epenarra Elliott, Canteen Creek, Tennant Creek & Mungkarta. The aim of the program is to sustain & enliven community arts enterprise within these communities.

FESTIVALS & EVENTS

BRA is a producer and presenter of local and incoming events in the region

<u>Events</u>

BRA produces, over the course of a year, local exhibitions, film and music events for all ages and is the major event provider for the Tennant Creek Territory Day. Outcomes of these events can also include touring the works in the Territory or interstate.

BRA also presents interstate and Territory productions and provides technical resources, personnel, media documentation and BRA event management including operations and logistics.

BRA is a supporter of local community events by providing technical resources, personnel and media documentation.

Desert Harmony Festival

BRA produces and presents the regions arts and culture festival annually. The program is a mixture of locally produced work, grass root community events and interstate touring shows.

8CCC RADIO

This Tennant Creek station is a three-way partnership between BRA, 8CCC Alice Springs and CAAMA Radio. The station sits within the BRA premise to manage the station, produce programs and to make it available to the broader community.

NYINKKA SCULPTURE TC Entrance Statement

Barkly Regional Arts, won the tender to create 2 x 8 metre Nyinkka sculptures for the NT Governments 'Tennant Creek Entrance Statements' project. The Nyinkka sculpture project, which began in October and goes through to February, employs Indigenous

woman, Shirley Lewis and BRA'S WMMC employees Reggie O'Riley (Kudanji Traditional Owner), Dirk Dickenson (Warumungu/ Warlpiri / Warlmanpa) and Waylon Ward (Wambaya/ Kudanji). The project will be completed in February 2019.



WOMAD Professional Development

2019 will be the final year of engagement for WMMC staff to work at WOMAD as part of a 3-year contract. Each year, four WMMC employees head to Adelaide to join the NOVATECH crew in audio and media production working on the main stages. The team are



mentored in working with the latest technology and best practice in technical support on a major event. Plus its a chance to access great work from all over the world.

'WHAT'S UP WMC' SERIES 3

The Winanjjikari Music Media Centre will produce Series 3 of Winanjjikari Music's 'What's Up WMC' program. Originally a radio show that expanded into media videos from Media Mob, the series teaches language, music lessons and cultural activities of the fellas at WMC. The series will



have a public event as part of the Desert Harmony Festival and audiences will be able to access the series through BRA video channels, social media, IndigiTube and on radio through 8CCC.





'MY ART, MY CULTURE' SERIES LAUNCH

This beautiful series brings to life the stories behind the 'Artists of the Barkly' artworks. Filmed and edited by Media Mob, each video highlights the culture, the language and inspiration of the art work for the artsist. Some of the videos have already been seen at the Partjimma

Festival, on ICTV and in an exhibition in Poland, though we will officially launch the entire series at this years 30th Desert Harmony Festival, which celebrates through a 'My Art, My Culture' theme.

ROMAN RUDNYTSKY Concert Pianist






BARKLY ARTIST CAMP Professional Development

THE SHED- ARTIST STUDIO Stage 1

The Festival will celebrate its 30th birthday in 2019, with a 'My Art, My Culture' theme. Having moved into our new premise at the Tennant Creek show grounds, the festival still has a large focus on infrastructure development. The Festival will put funds into updating the 'Kunapa

Hall' exhibition space and work towards completing the Timana Tucker House. It is also the first year of putting into place the new 3 year Strategic Plan of the Festival.

BAMFEST Music Event

The Barkly Area Music Festival is an event created by BRA's Winanjjikari Music Centre for the Desert Harmony festival. Its the opportunity for musicians in the Barkly to have a platform to share their music to an audience and develop their stage skills. WMC

engage local bands and find a headline act for the night, plus they run all the technical operations of the show. The event has been predominately Indigenous only, but opened the event to all Barkly musicians in 2018. Tech and music workshops occur prior to event.



MADAMA BUTTERFLY Opera Australia

Madama Butterfly is a love story that reaches across cultures, across oceans, across time. Hear Opera Australia's wonderful singers perform with a chamber orchestra, along with the Barkly children's chorus. The show is performed in Italian and will have English



subtitles on a screen. A pre-show presentation of Barkly musician's and the Chamber orchestra will also occur. This event will be a part of the Desert Harmony Festival program on Saturday August 3rd.

MY URRWAI Comedy/Movement Show

My Urrwai tells a sensitive and deeply personal story, an autobiographical show weaving together spoken story and movement. As a contemporary mainland Torres Strait Islander woman, dancer, actor, comedian, all-rounder who carries the responsibility of being



the only one able to pass on her Grandmothers dance. This work is a peeling back of the many layers that make up G: Happy G, Funny G, Scary G, Sporty G. Ghenoa is a multi-disciplinary artist bringing together her multiple talents to tell a very black, very contemporary, unique story.

CAMP HARMONY Youth Show

The Barkly youth take to the stage and show off their talents at the 'Camp Harmony' show case event. An explosive hour of dance and music by the young people, this event is a culmination of a week long workshop of arts activities. Young people sign up



for a week long arts workshop. 'Camp Harmony' offers up to 5 different art workshops (dance, music, theatre, DJ, acrobatics etc) each run by a professional artist. Young people spend a week in one art form, learning new skills and devising a show to present. Sunday August 4th.

Hip Hop Dance Show

In Between Tiny Cities, dancers Erak Mith, from Phnom Penh, and Aaron Lim, from Darwin, use the rituals, movement styles and language of their shared hip-hop culture to reveal the dramatically

different worlds that surround them and uncover the choreographic links that unit them. Choreographed by internationally-renowned Sydney hiphop dance artist Nick Power, and accompanied by the beats and sound design of Jack Prest, the work blends the raw, wild energy of b*boy battles with skilful improvisation and choreography, offering cross-cultural perspective on style, culture and locality. CREATIVE BARKLY Aus. Research Centre

An ARC Linkage project that brings together academic experts and experienced researchers with highly experienced industry bodies, Barkly Regional Arts (BRA) and Regional Development Australia NT (RDANT). Key representatives from BRA and RDNT join senior researchers from

QCRC (Griffith University), Batchelor Institute of Indigenous Tertiary Education and Southern Cross University for a three-year period (2016 - 2019) to measure the social and economic impact that Barkly Regional Arts, and by extension the creative industries, are having on regional economies such as the Barkly Region. The findings of the research will be presented this year.
